

BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) Instructions for Obtaining Recommended Vaccinations and/or Tests

Vaccination clinics are being held on an appointment basis for Health Authority employees in the Lower Mainland. The PHSA Occupational Health Nurses are now using the **JaneApp** for booking staff vaccinations.

Step 1: Immunization Appointment Booking

- To book an appointment for your recommended vaccinations, use the below link:

- For those in the Interior Health Authority, Northern Health Authority or Island Health Authority (Central, South and North Region), please contact the PHSA Occupational Health Nurses for further instructions before receiving vaccination(s). The nurses can be reached by email at OccupationalHealthNursing@phsa.ca or by telephone at 604-875-7244.
- **Print a copy of your employee vaccine & immunity status report and bring it to your appointment, so the vaccinator will know what is recommended.**

Step 2: Report your vaccinations/tests

- If you have vaccination/test updates or records, please submit them using the Vaccination Status Self-Reporting tool at: <https://healthandsafety.healthcarebc.ca/> by selecting the “**Existing Employee**” option.
- If you receive vaccinations at a PHSA, VCH, or Island Health staff immunization clinic, the records will be updated in your employee record accordingly.

Note: If your COVID-19 vaccine was given outside of BC, please use the link: <https://immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca/> to register your COVID-19 vaccine into the Provincial Immunization Registry (please use Chrome).

Step 3: Self-look-up report

- To access your employee vaccination & immunity status, refer to the self-look-up report by selecting the link: [BCEHS](#) or by copying the link:

- Your self-look-up report is only accessible from the health organization networks.

Step 4: IF lab tests are recommended

If lab tests have been recommended for you, please follow up with a Health Care Provider (HCP) to discuss post-vaccine testing.

- **NOTE:** If you have had a previous Reactive (Immune) Hepatitis B titre (blood test), please contact the Provincial Workplace Health Contact Centre (PWHCC) to discuss this with a nurse before following the above instructions.
- Please follow up with your HCP for your titre results to determine if further vaccinations may be recommended.
