Providence Health Care (PHC) Instructions for Obtaining Recommended Vaccinations and/or Tests

Step 1: Vaccination appointment booking

The following locations carry all vaccinations for PHC staff (including Hepatitis B):

- Shopper's Drug Mart 1125 Davie St (by SPH),
- Shopper's Drug Mart at Kingsgate Mall (by MSJ)
- Pharmasave 5791 Oak St (near Residential sites)
- Travel Medicine & vaccination centres (with authorization letter found on PHC Connect OH&S-Immunizations)
- Print a copy of your employee vaccine & immunity status report and bring it to your appointment, so the vaccinator will know what is recommended.

Step 2: Baseline TB screening

- New employees to PHC who have not had a TST/CXR as a health care worker or as a student in BC will need a baseline on hire.
- Employees from out of province will need a baseline TST/CXR regardless of when they last were screened.
 - Check PHC Connect-Occupational Health & Safety-Immunizations: for TST clinic dates/times

Step 3: Report your vaccinations/tests

- If you have vaccination/test updates or records, please submit them using the Vaccination Status Self-Reporting tool at: https://healthandsafety.healthcarebc.ca/ by selecting the "Existing Employee" option.
- If you receive vaccinations at a PHSA or Island Health staff immunization clinic, the records will be updated in your employee record accordingly.

Note: If your COVID-19 vaccine was given outside of BC, please use the link: https://immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca/ to register your COVID-19 vaccine into the Provincial Immunization Registry (please use Chrome).

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Step 4: Self-look-up report

- To access your employee vaccination & immunity status, refer to the self-look-up report by selecting the link: PHC or by copying the link: https://ohsbi.phsa.ca/sites/phc/OHS/WMO05003.rdl (please use Chrome or Edge).
- Your self-look-up report is only accessible from the health organization networks.

Step 5: IF lab tests are recommended

<u>If</u> lab tests have been recommended for you, please follow up with a Health Care Provider (HCP) to discuss post-vaccine testing.

- **NOTE:** If you have had a previous Reactive (Immune) Hepatitis B titre (blood test), please contact the Provincial Workplace Health Contact Centre (PWHCC) to discuss this with a nurse <u>before</u> following the above instructions.
- Please follow up with your HCP for your titre results to determine if further vaccinations may be recommended.

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
